On Friday 24th June the US Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade, stating that there never was a federal constitutional right to an abortion. "Roe was egregiously wrong from the start," Justice Samuel Alito wrote in his majority opinion. "It's reasoning was exceptionally weak, and the decision has had damaging consequences."

For almost 50 years abortion was erroneously regarded as a constitutional right in the United States an many other nations followed its example. The Supreme Court ruling this week recognizes that abortion is not a constitutional right and it is therefore up to the states to make their own laws governing the issue.
